- Incoming non-teaching staff must be individually accepted by the Institute of History. The acceptance depends on the proposed plan of work and the capability of the above mentioned Institute to host visitors.

- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- PL KRAKOW01: Students can obtain their transcripts of records directly from the Jagiellonian University system USOSweb.

#### 4. Termination of the agreement

Termination of this agreement or changes in the data set above can be amended annually, if communicated before 1 September. This means that an unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges or changes in the agreement notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the interinstitutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1.
